We are putting the finishing touches on it to make sure that everything is pristine and we've coordinated a move-in date just a few days away that aligns with their virtual school schedule so these girls won't miss a beat.

Having all of our dearly loved children together at Finca Grace has been a dream for quite some time. And now, after years of prayer, pleading with the Lord, He has faithfully provided more than we could have imagined. Praise God for His faithfulness and abundant generosity to His children! We believe that this is a milestone for FCM and we wait with eager anticipation to see all of the ways God will use this for His glory. Not only will this affect the daily life of the girls and boys, but it will also affect our missionaries, staff, community, and teams in some very positive ways.

It was our desire to host a "grand opening" ceremony at the farm, but because of the resurgence in Covid cases and the heightened threat to children within this new Delta variant, we have decided to postpone the celebration until we can do it in style, the way our lovely
